

## **Reformation Revelations!**

The reformer, Martin Luther, was a powerful, influential man whose personal quest for peace with God launched widespread change in the church and laid a new foundation for society. As a young monk, Luther searched the Scriptures to ease his anxieties about sin and salvation. He became convinced that the Roman Catholic Church had lost sight of its central themes. Luther challenged the church by posting his Ninety-five Theses on the door of the Wittenberg Church, and act that guaranteed attention. Rome responded quickly, demanding Luther to retract his remarks and eventually declaring him and outlaw.

Despite its best efforts, the hierarchy of the church could not suppress Martin Luther. These dramatics events of his life sparked discontent that had been smoldering for centuries. Luther's writings were widely read and accepted as the Renaissance ended and the Reformation began. His words continue to influence the church today as Christians rely on the truth of God's Word. And yet, today, we may question whether what Martin Luther did so many centuries ago has any relevance. The answer is a resounding "YES!"

Millions and millions of people throughout the past few centuries have been able to depend on the Word of God alone for their support and strength, their comfort and peace. Instead of depending on their own strength (which is feeble at best) and their own goodness (which constantly fails), Martin Luther encourages faithful Christians to depend on the promise and the power of God for their salvation. This message, taken from God's Word alone, has been and will continue to be the heart of Christian (especially Lutheran!) theology and doctrine: Apart from Christ, there is no salvation, and in Christ there is no fear of death.

The last Sunday of this month is the celebration of the Reformation, when we remember the day that sparked a revival in the Christian church, a return to the Word of God, and a renewal of faith in Christ alone. This month, please consider donating your time, treasure, and talents to the support of the spread of the Gospel through the various Lutheran Church Missouri Synod auxiliary groups and organizations.

Besides our own video streaming service that we produce here at First Lutheran there are many other devotional options available to you. For example, The Lutheran Hour can be heard on Sunday mornings beginning at 9:30 a.m. on WLCM 1390 AM. Lutheran Ministries Media "Worship Anew" can be seen on the TCT-TV channel (available on both Comcast and WOW) beginning at 11:30 a.m. on Sundays as well. Thrivent and the Lutheran Church Extension Fund are great resources for building a financial future for yourself and First Lutheran Church. And organizations like Lutheran Child and Family Services or the Lutheran Women's Missionary League can always use prayers and donations to accomplish the great tasks that God has given them

During this time of Reformation and Revelation, may God keep your hearts and minds focused on our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

#### WHAT WE BELIEVE

# Scripture Alone

We believe that the Holy Scriptures in their entirety are the inspired and infallible Word of God and that they alone are the only source and norm of faith and life for the Christian. We believe that the Bible is complete and requires no additions from any other source and that it clearly reveals God's plan of salvation for mankind.

#### Faith Alone

We believe that man was originally created holy by God but later rebelled against God and is now, by his nature, spiritually dead and blind. Only when man is brought to faith by the Holy Spirit working through the Word of God is it possible for man to be saved. Faith is God's work - not man's work - and comes only by hearing the Word of God. Man is justified before God by faith alone and not by good deeds.

#### Grace Alone

We believe that we are saved by grace alone and that man cannot earn his way into God's favor. Grace is the undeserved love of God who sent His Son Jesus into the world to take our place under God's law and to suffer and die to pay the penalty for our sins. Whoever trusts in that redemptive act of Jesus Christ will not perish but have everlasting life.
